**Please be aware that requests for children to take holidays during term time will be classed as an unauthorised absence.**


**Please be aware that unauthorised absences that exceed 5 school days during term time will receive a fixed penalty notice (FPN).**

We've had a great week and have been so busy learning lots of new things. We've really enjoyed being in our new vets role play area and have been helping lots of animals feel better.

A big focus for us this week has been maths and we have been exploring counting beyond 10.

Our new English text is called Silly Doggy and we have been writing sentences about the different animals that may have made the footprints found.



In Geography we have been exploring the different ways that land can be used. We have identified urban and rural areas and even designed our own city!


In Religion, we have been looking forward to our new topic, which is deepening our understanding of Easter and the Pentecost. We have taken time to reflect on giving, kindness and new life.

There will be a Quiz, Shared table and Fancy Dress competition for the children. All are welcome!




