

In Maths, we have been looking at subtracting a 2 digit number from a 2 digit number, we found it tricky to begin with but with our resources we started to get it. In Science, we have been looking at what humans and animals need to survive, with completing a little experiment linked with how animals blend into their surroundings to protect them from predators.

In Geography this week we have discussed which country we would like to live in and why. Linking it to how close the continent is to the Equator. In PE, we have been carrying on with our gymnastics unit, with focusing on different jumps this week.

In Music, we have been singing in Swahili as part of our focus on African music. In 'The Way, The Truth and The Life' we have looked at Mary and Joseph's preparation for Jesus' birth.

On Wednesday, some of us took a visit to our Reading Castle and loved reading the different books - we can't wait for our slot again next Wednesday! Throughout the week we have also looked at our British Values, Parliament week, Anti-bullying week and Children in Need!



Yew Class


Another exciting and wonderful week in Yew Class! On Monday we celebrated World Kindness Day, each child was given a special card with a message of kindness to hand out to anyone of their choosing in our school community.

In science this week, we have been looking at the digestive system. We started our lesson by chewing bread and observing what happened to the food in our mouths. We also explored the process of food being broken down in the stomach. We placed crackers in a plastic bag and used orange juice to represent the stomach acid. We then squeezed the bag to break down the crackers and made observations of the changes that occurred.

This week we also celebrated antibullying week by wearing odd socks to school on Monday and creating an anti-bullying poster.

On Thursday, we took part in a lantern workshop for the Frodsham Christmas parade. The children had a wonderful time and the lanterns look amazing!

In English, we have also started our new text and, on Wednesday, we watched a thought provoking advert which made people think about what they need to do to protect the tiger.
