The parade will end at the junction with Marsh Lane. Again we ask for your patience, please inform a member of staff before collecting your child.



Overall Attendance this week **97.5%.** Across the school, **1 hour 25 minutes** of learning time was lost this week through late arrivals.

In maths year 1 have been working hard to solve subtraction problems using number lines. Reception have been recognising numbers to 10 and representing them in different ways.

In science we have carried out our experiment to find out which material would be the best to use to wrap a present. We worked hard with this and we recorded our findings.

In DT we have been looking at what windmills are and how we can make a stable structure.

In 'The Way, The Truth and The Life' we have been learning about when Mary told Elizabeth the good news about Jesus. We have also started learning about the Christmas story in our Nativity...



# **Elm Class**

Elm class have had a fabulous week! In English, we have been writing a letter to Plop's cousin telling them how amazing the dark is, as well as, planning our non-chronological report about owls!

In Maths, we have been looking at comparing number sentences and finding the answer to missing number problems using the inverse!

In Science, we have looked at a balanced diet. We discussed what snacks are healthy and what snacks we can eat occasionally. Then, we designed our own healthy meal.

In 'The Way, The Truth and The Life', we have been looking at Advent and what we can do to prepare for it.

In Music, we have carried on with our topic looking at Africa and been learning a song. We have also been practicing playing the African drums!

In P.E. we have been learning new balances as part of our Gymnastics unit.



## **Yew Class**

Yew class have worked extremely hard this week! In History we used secondary sources such as the iPads and information books to retrieve information about Fu Hao and we wrote a fact file about her life. Year 4's wrote a conclusion considering the significance of Fu Hao's role in the Shang Dynasty.

In DT, we continued looking at our topic of castles. We used geometric 2D shapes and arranged them to make a castle. This will help us as we work towards our final piece of constructing a 3D castle using the nets of 2D shapes.

In Maths, Year 4 have been learning about area. We have been counting squares to calculate the area of different shapes. In Year 3, we have started looking at multiplication facts. We have been using counters to make arrays and used these to find the related multiplications.




# **Cypress Class**

We also looked at how our energy consumption compares to the energy consumption of the United States which was a very interesting analysis and discussion.

In maths, Year 5 have been applying their knowledge of addition and subtraction to multi-step worded problems whilst Year 6 have been working on mastering long division. Both year groups have been working so hard and demonstrated excellent perseverance.

In our English lessons, we have been working on using parenthesis within our writing. We answered questions about the tigers and included additional information using brackets, dashes or commas.
