Cherry Class

In English we have started our new text and we have been using the clues to predict what might happen. We think it might be about a woolly mammoth who comes back from the past...

In Maths year 1 have been learning about numbers up to 50 and different ways we can count larger numbers carefully.

Reception have been exploring more complex patterns and have been creating patterns for their friends to continue.

In History Year 1 have been comparing toys from now and from 100 years ago and talking about similarities and differences. We love exploring the old toys.

Reception have been comparing Frodsham now and long ago. We have been looking at photographs of different places in Frodsham and how they have changed. We can't believe there used to be a high school where the library/doctors is and we were amazed at how old the market was!

In Science reception have been talking about how animal babies grow and whether they look like their adults. We have been matching adult animals with their babies.

Year 1 have been sorting animals into different groups such as animals with feathers, animals that live in water, animals with beaks. There are so many ways we can sort them!

In DT we have started making our moving books. We have explored how to make prototype moving mechanisms and we have started to design our pages.

We enjoyed World Book Day and all of the fantastic costumes. The children explored lots of reading activities, looking at different types of books and looked for inspiration when creating our own books.



Elm Class

Elm Class has had a very busy and exciting week!

In English, we have been discussing everyday heroes and what makes someone a hero, and I am very excited to read their letters to their heroes today!

In science, the children were creating food chains from a set of animals and placing the words consumer, producer, prey and predator on the correct animal.

It was World Book day this week! Elm class wore some amazing costumes and had a great day, including a whole school assembly showing off our character spoons and costumes, writing book reviews and a trip to the school library!



Yew Class

Yew Tree Class have had an extremely busy and exciting week! In Science this week, we started our new topic of 'Sound'. We learned that sound is produced by vibrations. We played a mystery sound game where we had to guess the object that was producing sound. We then observed what happens to rice on a drum when the drum is tapped. We observed the rice jump and listened to the sound it produced.

On Wednesday, we had a wonderful trip to Chester Zoo. We started our day by visiting the elephants and the lions before our rainforest workshop. In our workshop we used our geography and science knowledge to complete lots of different activities. We used our knowledge of teeth to match the skulls of different rainforest animals based on their diets. We explored some different products that are produced by different plants such as medicine, rubber, chocolate and coffee. We also learned about the different layers of the rainforest and how we can find sustainable palm oil products that help reduce deforestation. The children really enjoyed seeing all the animals and took lots of photos on the ipads.

We also celebrated World Book Day on Thursday, there were lots of amazing costumes and entries to the story spoon competition. We loved our visit to Frodsham library to listen to some amazing storytelling. We also celebrated International Women's Day by using books to write a fact file about an inspirational woman and her achievements.

What a busy week it has been! On Tuesday, Chris from Cheshire Fire Service visited our class for the afternoon to deliver an incredibly important workshop all about fire safety. He discussed the importance of having an action plan in case of a fire in your home and gave a top tip to 'test it on a Tuesday', highlighting the importance of testing smoke alarms regularly.

On Wednesday afternoon, we were finding out more about the Magna Carta in our history lesson. We explored the reasons for it and found out more about King John and the decisions he made as king. We found it interesting that, although it was written many years ago, the Magna Carta is still relevant today.

It was World Book Day on Thursday and we thoroughly enjoyed the day. After our whole school assembly (to show off our costumes), we then made our way to Frodsham Leisure Centre as we had been invited to take part in Frodsham Library's World Book Day celebrations. They had invited a theatre group to perform/ retell a story for us and we really enjoyed listening to it. The group were also really keen to share all about how they made their props and set and it was great to hear all about how they had used all recycled items to make everything they used in the show. During the day, we also enjoyed time in the library and completed a personal development lesson based on a book called 'Mixed'.
