We have had another busy week investigating measure and capacity in maths and working hard to write our own story in English.

In English we have created our own characters, setting and mischief for our main characters to get up to. We have edited our own work to see how we can improve it.

We have had another fun practical maths week exploring capacity using water trays and different containers to see which were full, empty and how many cups could fit into different jugs.

In Science have been finding out about diets of different animals. We found out about carnivores, omnivores and herbivores and which animals fit into which groups.

We then used wire and tissue paper to create sculptures of flowers and leaves for a collaborative art piece.

On Tuesday, we had our second art workshop, we added the finishing touches to our Chiezo-inspired drawings before making butterfly sculptures using cardboard and tissue paper. We then learned some origami skills as we created butterfly sculptures using paper and wire.

We had a wonderful afternoon playing outside in the dry weather and settled down for a campfire in the evening. We enjoyed toasting (and eating!) our marshmallows around the fire.

On our final day, we developed our collaboration and teamwork skills on the zipline, tree climbing and low ropes course. We all worked together to ensure the safety of each member of the group.





# **Cypress Class**

We have had another wonderful week in Cypress Tree Class. We have all really enjoyed writing our hot tasks this week. After hearing Greta Thunberg's speech to the EU leaders and researching all about plastic pollution, we wrote our own persuasive speeches to try to make world leaders understand the importance of this issue and stress the urgency needed to rescue our planet before it is too late. Paragraphs, relative clauses, cohesion and carefully chosen vocabulary were used to create lots of exceptional pieces of writing and the speeches certainly got the message across!

On Wednesday, our Personal Development lesson focused on how different lifestyle choices impact on health. We had a class discussion and a debate and then looked at some interesting facts about the impact that smoking and alcohol has on organs within the body. After looking at two case studies that shared details of two different people's lives, we made suggestions about what they could do to improve their lifestyle and their health.

In this week's art lesson, we were using Fiona Rae's beautiful artwork as inspiration for our own designs. With a focus on using the different skills we have been developing, we started with adding washes of colour before layering and using different marks to create a final piece.
