Mary brought in a pound of very costly ointment, pure nard, and with it anointed the feet of Jesus, wiping them with her hair; the house was full of the scent of the ointment. Then Judas Iscariot – one of his disciples, the man who was to betray him - said, 'Why wasn't this ointment sold for three hundred denarii, and the money given to the poor?' He said this, not because he cared about the poor, but because he was a thief; he was in charge of the common fund and used to help himself to the contributions. So Jesus said, 'Leave her alone; she had to keep this scent for the day of my burial. You have the poor with you always, you will not always have me.' John 12

This tells us that we should pay attention to everything that is happening this week. Jesus begins the week having to sort out an argument between his friends – it is not going to get any better.


Loving God, May everything I aspire to begin with your inspiration.

Maundy Thursday


Maundy – comes from an old word meaning commandment. In John's Gospel, Jesus shows his friends how they are to continue his work by serving others –

'Knowing that the time had come for Him to return to His Heavenly Father, Jesus and His disciples gathered to celebrate one last Passover meal together. Getting up from the table, He poured some water into a basin and, wrapping a towel around his waist, began to wash the feet of His disciples. When it was Peter's turn he tried to stop *Jesus by saying, 'Lord, it is not right* that you should be washing my feet.' But Jesus said to all of them, 'I, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet. I have shown you how it should be, so that you will go away and wash each other's feet.' John 13







Good Friday

'They then took charge of Jesus, and carrying his own cross he went out of the city to the place of the skull or, as it was called in Hebrew, Golgotha, where they crucified him with two others, one on either side with Jesus in the middle. Pilate wrote out a notice and had it fixed to the cross; it ran: 'Jesus the Nazarene, King of the Jews.' This notice was read by many of the Jews, because the place where Jesus was crucified was not far from the city, and the writing was in Hebrew, Latin and Greek. So the Jewish chief priests said to Pilate, You should not write 'King of the Jews,' but 'This man said: "I am King of the Jews."' Pilate answered, What I have written, I have written.' John 18 The Passion of our Lord Jesus Christ
