<ul> <li>Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Tasks</li> <li>Practise the Year 3/4 for <u>Common Exception</u> words.</li> <li>Practise your spelling on <u>Spelling Frame</u></li> <li>Choose 5 Common Exception words. Write a synonym, antonyms, the meaning and an example of how to use the word in a sentence. Can the word be modified?</li> <li>Choose 5 Common Exception words and practise spelling them using words within words. Write the word and find smaller words within them, e.g. spelling = line, gel, in, etc</li> <li>Spelling and grammar tasks are set on a Monday. This week's task is a grammar recap. Work through the questions that focus on different areas of grammar.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Writing Tasks</li> <li>Write a postcard to a family member recounting a celebration that has just taken place.</li> <li>Write a set of instructions for 'How to play the new game?' ### Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus and different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

### Let's Wonder:

How are birthdays celebrated around the world? <u>India China America Africa</u> etc.. maybe there's a particular country they would like to find out about. Create fact files to show the similarities and differences between them.

## Let's Create:

Create a board game that focuses on celebrations. Think about what they can learn from it? Think about how to play the game. Is it going to be a game like Monopoly or Snakes and ladders? Are they going to need a dice? Cards? Characters? etc....

#### Be Active:

Why not play a game of <u>hopscotch</u>? Can't find any chalk? Use a stone from the garden. Raining? Build an indoor den and have an imaginary celebration with their toys. *Recommendation at least 2 hours of exercise a week.* 

## • Time to Talk:

Look through old photos of previous celebrations them and their family have taken part in. What can they remember happened? Why do they and their families celebrate the way they do?

## <u>Understanding Others and Appreciating differences:</u>

How many different types of celebrations are there? Who celebrates Christmas? St Patricks? St George? St David? Easter? Eid? Diwali? Chinese new year? And how? Which celebrations have they taken part in? What usually happens?

## Other activity ideas

- Create a birthday calendar that includes all the birthdays in your family. This could be presented in any way you like, using any format. It could be designed to be put up in your house somewhere are used a helpful reminder throughout the year for all the family.
- Following on from last week's theme of food, design a menu for a special celebration meal. What would you have for Starter, Main Course and Dessert? Who would you invite? What would your celebration take place?
- Set a budget and plan a celebration around that budget. How would you save money? What would you buy?
- Write a diary entry of a time when you have been part of a celebration. What were you celebrating? What did you do to celebrate? How did you feel?
