Elm Class

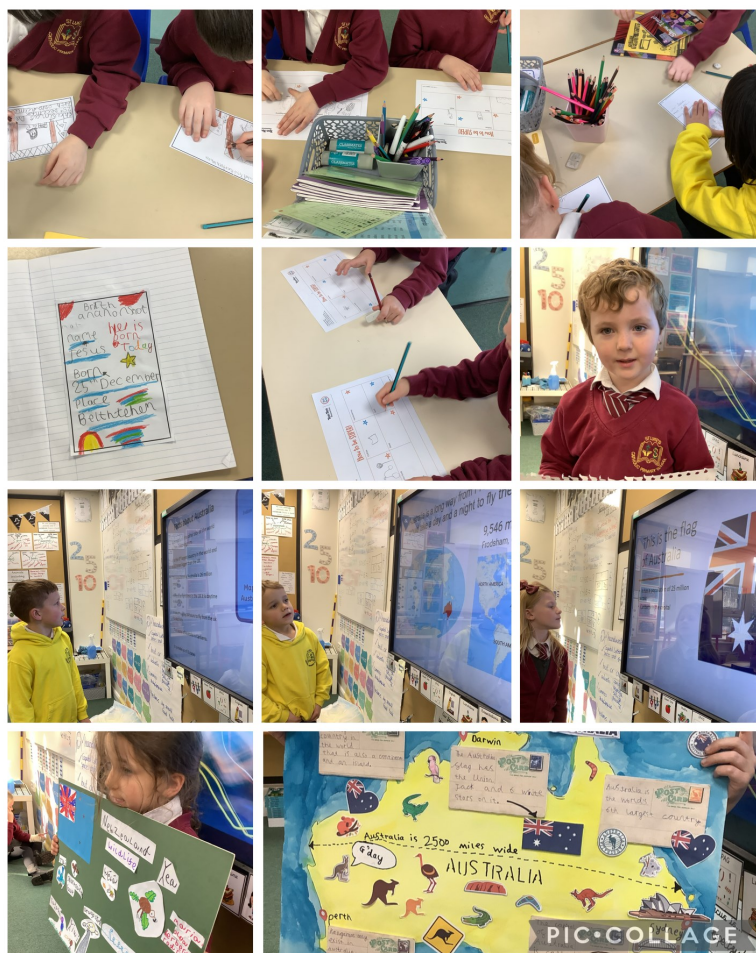
Elm class have had a fabulous week. We have been busy rehearsing our Nativity, which we can't wait to show you!

Yew tree class have been extremely busy this week and have worked incredibly hard!

This week we have been presenting our "Where's Luca?" geography homework. All the children have spent lots of time and effort into their homework and we have all enjoyed sharing our research with the class. We have learned lots of interesting facts about different countries in North and South America.

In science we continued looking at the digestive system. We observed what happens to food as it enters the small and large intestines. We then drew the digestive system and labelled the functions of the different organs.

In DT this week we identified different features of castles such as turrets, battlements, drawbridges and moats. We were then given the brief of designing a castle for King Charles using the features that we learned about. We will use these designs to help us with the construction of our final piece.

After a busy weekend spreading Christmas cheer on the Frodsham Festival Float, Cypress Tree Class have had another busy week and have been working really hard. Alongside completing assessments for autumn term assessment week, we have enjoyed learning more about different countries from the Asia from our homework presentations. It has been wonderful to see the children feel more confident to stand up in front of the class and the research and work which has gone into the homework task has been great.

In our English lessons this week, we have been learning about parenthesis and modal verbs and learning about when we *should* include them within our writing. As our text is called 'Can we save the tiger?', we have been finding out more about tigers to create an information sheet about them (including parenthesis, where we can).

In our history lesson this week, we have been making comparisons between Ancient Maya homes and the homes that we live in today. We discovered that the wealthy homes often had steam baths in whilst the poorer homes were made out of mud, sticks and grass.

On Thursday, we were delighted to be part of the grand opening of the reading shed. We love reading in Cypress Tree Class and can't wait to spend time in there enjoying a good book. Thank you to everyone involved in building and creating this wonderful space.
