Cherry Class

In English have started our new story -Toys In Space. We have predicted what the story might be about and we have been writing sentences containing the prefix un.

Reception have been writing number sentences to 5 and thinking of stories to match the number sentences. Year 1 have started a new multiplication unit and we are working on counting in 10s, 5s and 2s.

Reception have been exploring different types of globes and maps to find out about different places in the world. Year 1 have been learning about the different continents and talking about different types of holidays people have been on.

In Science we have been finding out whether wildflowers grow on our school grounds. We used magnifying glasses to explore school and record what we found.

We loved undertaking our sponsored litter pick in the school grounds today. We collected lots of litter and we hope to keep the school ground nice a clean!



Elm Class

Year 2 are coming to the end of a very busy week indeed!

We enjoyed our residential to Delamere so much! It was so much fun and the children had the best time. We enjoyed pond-dipping and catching mini beasts in the stream, our wellies were definitely put to good use! We also had a great time around the campfire, enjoying some toasted marshmallows and singing. Our trip ended with a blast, building dens using sticks and pine needles, and even getting a turn in a hammock!

We have been learning about coastlines in geography, learning what makes a place a coast, and what things we might see there.

We have also been doing some fantastic writing in English, writing a diary from the point of view of The Last Wolf, The last Bear and The last Lynx from our story, The Last Wolf.



Yew Class

In science this week, we started our new topic of electricity. We were first given pictures of different household objects and were asked what they all had in common. We deduced that they were all electrical. We learned that electricity is a form of energy that gives appliances the ability to move, produce sound, heat or light. We were then asked to identify how we could group our appliances. We inferred that the images could be sorted into mains powered and battery powered. We then used an image of a house to identify mains powered and battery powered appliances. We created Venn diagrams to group different electrical and non-electrical objects. Year 4 then created a key and highlighted the objects according to whether they produced light, sound, heat or movement.

In geography we began our unit 'Where does our food come from?'. Firstly, we were given a world map and were asked to place pictures of food based on where we thought they originated from. We then learned that different foods require certain soil and weather conditions to be able to grow properly. We were then given a map of the climate zones and matched their characteristics to the different zones. After, it was revealed to us the countries where some food originates from. We used an atlas to locate these countries and identify what climate zones they are in.



Cypress Class

It has been another busy week in Cypress Tree Class. Angles has been a theme in this week's maths lessons; Year 5 have enjoyed learning how to accurately measure angles using protractors whilst Year 6 have been recapping on how to calculate different angles within a triangle before learning about the different parts of a circle.

On Tuesday, we started investigating light in our science lesson. Using torches and cardboard tubes, we set up our investigation to find out how light travels and explore whether light can bend. Before we completed our experiment, we made our own predications making sure we used scientific vocabulary to explain our ideas. We discovered that light travels in straight lines and is often blocked by opaque materials.

We had a particularly busy day on Thursday when we took part in the sponsored litter pick. We also incorporated this with some geography fieldwork as we were keen to find out how much rubbish was found around the outskirts of our school grounds and also explore how many litter bins there were. We were really surprised to find out that a lot of the litter found was made up of plastic - with very few litter bins/ recycling bins in sight! After completing our investigation (and our litter pick to clean up the local envi-
