# **Cherry Class**

Year 1 have worked very hard this week completing their phonic screening checks! We are extremely proud of all of them! Well done!

We have almost finished our unit Toys in Space story in English. We have been working hard to write our own version of the story using all of our mastery skills that we have been working on. Our class story is called Dolphins in the Ocean. Will the giant squid find its lost pearl?

Reception have been learning to count and write numbers beyond 10. They have been using tens frames to help us count lots of objects and writing the numbers to match. Year 1 have been working on directions, rotating objects and using left and right.

We have been learning about different artists who create sculptures and we have been practicing different techniques to mould and join paper and card. We created our final pieces this week and the children are very proud of their creations.

In Science we have been learning about deciduous and evergreen trees and grouping them based on their characteristics. We are looking forward to spotting some in our local area.

In WTL we have started our unit Miracles and we have been learning about when Jesus calmed the storm and what this story might mean for us. Reception have been thinking about the church family and who is part of our faith community.



## **Elm Class**

Elm class has been working very hard this week. They have been working extremely hard in their English, writing diary entries and letters to characters, I am so impressed with their effort and enthusiasm.


In maths year 2 have been continuing with fractions, working on recognising three quarters and how to show this as a fraction.

In history this week they researched how David Attenborough is a modern-day explorer, and how his goal is to save the animals and their habitats.













### **Yew Class**

This week we have been focusing on our times tables. Year 4 completed their multiplication check and we are very proud of each other.

In English we finished writing our non-chronological reports on the Amazon rainforest. We have started our new topic 'Blue John'. We are very excited to continue with the story.

In science this week we have been learning about conductors and insulators. We set up an investigation to find out the best conductors of electricity. We planned our investigation and identified the variables we were going to observe and change. We used a metal spoon, tinfoil, coins, a rubber and paper in a circuit and observed whether the bulb lit.

In history we continued learning about the Bayeux tapestry. We looked at a picture of the Bayeux tapestry and described what we thought was happening in the scene. We then placed the scenes of the tapestry in chronological order to tell the story of the Battle of Hastings.



# **Cypress Class**

It has been a very busy week in Cypress Tree Class! Year 5 have been out and about enjoying lots of learning enrichment opportunities throughout the week. On Tuesday, they took part in Crucial Crew workshop in Northwich where they learnt all about how to safe. They all received a carbon monoxide detector after hearing all about the importance of having one of these in your home. Later on in the week, they had the most incredible opportunity to play alongside The Hallé Orchestra at Bridgewater Hall in Manchester. It was a fantastic concert where the children got to experience live music, showcase their violin playing talents and enjoy singing songs alongside other children from different primary schools.

Whilst Year 5 have been busy out and about, Year 6 have been preparing to take the starring roles in this year's Key Stage 2 Production. After reading the script, the class auditioned for their roles and we soon found that there are lots of talented actors within the class. Alongside all of these exciting things, we have also been working hard in the curriculum.
