Marigold Class

English—We have been working hard with our writing this week. Reception have been practicing their fine motor skills by creating and describing pictures of trolls. Year 1 and 2 have been using adjectives to describe Tabitha and we have written a letter to Grandma to tell her about Tabitha's terrible behaviour!

Maths—Reception have been counting carefully and finding the number card to match. Year 1 have also been finding one more and less and number bonds to 10 using tens frames. Year 2 have been counting tens and ones and solving problems and have started to complete times tables questions.

History—We have enjoyed looking at different sources of evidence this week, to find out about how hospitals and health has changed since the Victorian times. We noticed that uniforms had changed, technology and medicine is more advanced and the hospitals are much cleaner now.

Art—Reception have been looking at artwork by Paul Klee and talking about what they like/don't like about his work and what they have noticed. We have also been responding to different stimulus, for example, calm music, images of pumpkins etc, and creating artwork in response to this, choosing which colour, shape and material to use.

Vines and Branches—We have been learning about the story of Noah's Ark, in particular, why God chose Noah and the promises that God made after the flood.




Tulip Class

This week in English, Tulip class have been learning how to correctly use speech marks, and also considered alternative reporting clauses to 'said.' We came up with some fantastic examples such as 'spluttered', 'commanded' and 'explained'. In year 3, we re-wrote some dialogue from our class book 'Seal Surfer', whereas in Year 4 we added more detail to make our writing more interesting.

We have continued our work with Place Value this week, comparing numbers up to 1,000 in year 3, and up to 10,000 in year 4. We have used our skills to dig deeper into some challenges which we have enjoyed.

In Geography this week, we have continued our work on villages, towns and cities and have learnt some new vocabulary such as 'urban' and 'rural.' We made our own leaflets to tell people what it is like to live in those places.

We were lucky to visit Frodsham library this week. We learnt all about their resources available including books, e-books, and free printing! We heard a story called 'The Wonky Donkey' and had fun taking part (and even hearing the adults take part too)! We want to thank the parent helpers that helped us on this trip.



Bluebell Class

We've had a great week in Bluebell Class. Throughout the week, we have all been so excited to read more of our class novel, Holes, and thoroughly enjoyed our whole class reading lesson linked with what we had read so far.

Another text which we are really enjoying is our English text (The Lost Happy Endings). We have been using it as inspiration to write and enjoyed writing a scene using dialogue and a character description linked with this beautiful book.

We love finding out more about our new geography topic and, on Tuesday, we learnt all about the lines of latitude and longitude and used these to help us describe the locations of the world's most famous mountains. We then conducted our own research to find out more about the different mountain ranges.
