Marigold Class

English—This week we have imagined what we might do if we travelled to space and we have written a diary entry. We have also enjoyed researching about Mae Jemison, the first African-American woman to travel to space.

Maths—Year 2 have been working hard to solve addition problems with no fingers allowed! We have been partitioning numbers to 10 then adding the ones to help with completing harder numbers mentally in the future. Year 1 have been solving addition problems and explaining how they know the answers. Reception have been learning about more than and fewer than and have been comparing amounts.

Geography—What is there in Frodsham? We have been exploring this question using different maps and using a grid to find a 2 digit grid reference for different places.

Art—We have finally finished our Marigold class Art Gallery and we are very proud of the results! What do you think?

Nativity—We have got our scripts and have been learning our songs! Please encourage your child to learn their lines. We can't wait to start looking through the costumes!




Tulip Class

Maths—This week, Tulip class have carried on learning about Addition and Subtraction. Year 4 have been consolidating their skills and applying them to estimation and finding efficient methods to complete fourdigit additions and subtractions. Year 3 have been learning how to add three-digit numbers using the column method. This has really helped them to be more accurate with making exchanges.

English—This week, we have read some more of our class novel and started thinking more about the character of Katherine and what she is like. We explored a range of pronouns that could make our writing more interesting, and started thinking about our mastery key: using conjunctions. We have started to compile a list of varied conjunctions we can use, and played a game of conjunction bingo to put these into practice.

Science—This week, we started learning about the human skeleton. We explored our own skeletons and started to learn some of the different names of bones. We made links to our topic about healthy eating and discussed why we need calcium to help our bones to be strong.

History—We conducted our own research this week about the Iron Age – we used an e-book to find out about what life was like, what jobs people did, what clothes people wore, and the houses that people lived in. We made posters to show what we had learnt, and next week we are excited to make comparisons across the whole period!



Bluebell Class

We have had another busy week in Bluebell Class. Following on from our work last week, our English lessons have been focused around another inspirational person from our key text. We have learnt about Bessie Coleman who was the first African-American woman and Native American to hold a pilot's license. After reading her inspirational story, we wrote a recount in the role of Bessie focusing particularly on the use of paragraphs and sentence openers. Alongside these two mastery keys, Year 5 were also working on incorporating subordinating conjunctions whilst Year 6 focused on including example of passive voice.

Our history lesson this week focused on democracy and how the ancient Greeks ran their country. It linked perfectly with our work centred around parliament week and we enjoyed making comparisons between then and now.

One of our favourite times of the day is when we read our class novel together. We are thoroughly enjoying 'Nevermoor: The Trials of Morrigan Crow' and have lots of queries and theories about the book. Each chapter is left on a cliffhanger that always leaves us wondering...what will happen next?
