Phonics Workshop

We will be offering advice on how best to support your child while building their confidence. A creche will be provided to allow parents to attend. Multiplication Check Meeting (Aimed at year 4,5,6 parents)

Children in year 4 undertake a Multiplication Check in June. This workshop will detail the arrangements for this and how you can help prepare your children. We will also discuss some of the methods using in class to teach multiplication and division.



Immunisation

As you may have seen in the press over Christmas, we are currently experiencing a challenging flu season with levels of infection much higher than last year. The School Age Immunisation Service are going to provide a drop-in clinic at Frodsham Childrens Centre on 15 January.



<u>Be A Flu Fighter</u>

Flu can be a very unpleasant illness for children and lead to serious problems like bronchitis or pneumonia. The free nasal flu vaccine is the best way to protect against flu.

Flu rates are rising and there is a sharp rise in patients in hospital with flu. Vaccination protects your child and the wider community.
